1. With reference to Regional Memorandum No. 759, s. 2024, re: Observance of the National Indigenous Peoples Month Celebration 2024 and by virtue of Presidential Proclamation No. 1906, s. 2009, titled “Declaring the Month of October of Every Year as National Indigenous Peoples Month,” this Division shall hold a culminating activity on October 28, 2024 at Kinuman Norte Covered Court, Kinuman Norte, Ozamiz City with the theme, “*Katutubong Karunungan Tungo sa Inklusibong Kaunlaran.*”
2. This activity aims to:
  - a) promote and raise awareness of the rich cultures of the indigenous peoples in the City of Ozamiz;
  - b) showcase the learning gains of IP learners through literacy-related contests/events, traditional games, songs, dances, music, artifacts, and symbols; and
  - c) recognize the contribution of stakeholders in the implementation of IPEd programs.
3. The celebration shall highlight the rich Subanen culture and tradition. Each participating district shall put up a booth featuring a display of indigenous foods, artifacts and other materials with cultural significance.

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**CONTEST RULES AND GUIDELINES**

**A. Subanen Storybook Reading**

The Subanen Storybook Reading Contest aims to promote the rich cultural heritage and storytelling traditions of the Subanen people. This contest invites participants to read and narrate Subanen folktales and stories from Subanen culture in an engaging and authentic manner.

**Contest Rules and Guidelines:**

1. There shall be 8 participants coming from each of the districts offering IPed.
2. The facilitator/organizer shall be the one to prepare the storybook to be read aloud by the participants.
3. The decision of the board of judges is final and irrevocable.

**Judging Criteria:**

Clarity/diction	- 40 %
Fluency	- 30%
Projection	- <u>30 %</u>
	100%

**B. Subanen Vocabulary and Culture Quiz Bee**

The Subanen Vocabulary and Culture Quiz Bee is designed to foster the growth and preservation of the Subanen language and culture. It aims to enhance the language's richness and utility for current and future generations.

**Contest Rules and Guidelines**

1. This contest is open to all 26 participating schools.



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2. There shall be 2 contestants, who will compose a team, from each of the 26 participating schools.
3. The facilitator/organizer shall prepare the vocabularies/words/questions to be used during the contest.
4. The contest will be held in three rounds:
  - Easy - 10 items (1 point each)
  - Average - 7 items (2 points each)
  - Difficult - 5 items (3 points each)
5. The easy round items will be given through multiple choice/true-false items. Meanwhile, the average and difficult rounds shall be given through identification/ simple recall.
6. The participants shall bring a tag board (bondpaper size), chalk and eraser to be used during the contest.

### **C. Subanen Dance Contest**

This dance contest is a celebration of indigenous culture that serves to preserve traditions, honor ancestors, and express joy. Through dance, Subanen people connect with their heritage, share stories, and foster community spirit.

#### **Contest Rules and Guidelines**

1. The Subanen Dance Contest is open to all participating districts. Each team must consist of at least 10 members and perform a dance routine lasting between 2 and 3 minutes.
2. The dance must be based on the Subanen Dance Steps Guidebook. Props may be used to enhance the performance, but they must be culturally appropriate.
3. The judges will evaluate each performance based on adherence to Subanen dance steps, cultural authenticity, choreography, sync and timing, and overall performance.
4. The team that best demonstrates these criteria will be declared the winner.
5. The decision of the judges is final and irrevocable.



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#### **D. Weaving Contest (*Paglala og Pugaran*)**

This weaving contest (*paglala og pugaran*) is a celebration of Subanen culture that promotes traditional weaving techniques. This is to showcase the skill and expertise of Subanen weavers. The contest helps to ensure the continued vitality of Subanen weaving traditions and contribute to the economic well-being of Subanen communities.

#### **Contest Rules and Guidelines**

1. The weaving contest is open to all participating schools.
2. There shall be two contestants per school who will compose a team. They must bring their own 2-meter long coconut leaves to use as weaving material.
3. The contest will have a duration of 30 minutes.
4. The judges will evaluate each team's work based on their weaving technique, pattern and design, neatness and finish, and the cultural significance of their woven piece.
5. The team which best demonstrates the criteria given will be declared the winner.

#### **E. Booth Display**

Each participating district shall set up a booth showcasing indigenous foods and materials. The booths will be judged based on their cultural authenticity, presentation, variety, informative content, creativity, and additional factors such as interaction and sustainability.
